Digital Inclusion is everyone's responsibility, but no one has overall ownership








Who is impacted?

- Where you find deprivation, you'll find digital deprivation.
- At risk groups include:
 - o 28,000 Unemployed
 - o 233,000 Economically Inactive
 - 1.700 16 & 17 Year Old NEETs
 - o 1,600 17-21 Year-Old Care Leavers
 - Over 1,500 individuals homeless or at risk of homelessness in LCR
 - o 307,000 Individuals Aged 65+
 - o 71,300 Food Parcels Distributed in 2021
 - 64,700 Pupils Eligible for Free School Meals
 - o 181,000 individuals on in-work & out-of-work Universal Credit
 - 30% of young people in low income households nationally don't have access to a laptop or computer
 - 18% of national households with income below £11,500 do not have home internet access
 - 56% of non-users of the internet are disabled adults.
 - 150,000 individuals in LCR not used internet in preceding 3 months
 - 325,000 individuals 'non-users' or 'low-users' of the internet in LCR

- Utilise network branding to showcase support and raise awareness of provision to the public










- Providing identified 'Digital Champions' training and signposting to a range of useful digital learning tools to help others make the most of being online.

Good Things Foundation

- Increasing the uptake of 'Good Things Foundation Digital Inclusion Hubs' across LCR
- ❖ 'National Databank' Engagement 105% increase in last 12 months. Once registered as a free Digital Inclusion Hub, you can receive free sim cards for participants only requirement is age over 18 and struggling with connectivity at home. Households can be supported. Schools & Colleges can register for free.
- Combined Authority are delivering through our programmes (Households into Work & Housing First) – pairing recycled phones with sim cards, supported over 250 individuals over last few months.
- ❖ LCRCA first Local Government Organisation outside of London to donate into the Devicebank – we can help facilitate engagement with GTF and provide advice on legal/assurance process if you have devices to donate.

 Providing free public wi-fi and broadband access to select community hubs in each local authority area
























What is the Digital Inclusion Initiative?

- The Digital Inclusion Initiative (DII) is an industry-led programme to tackle digital exclusion
- Liverpool City Region Combined Authority are facilitating the rollout of over 4,500 free android tablets, accompanied by 6 months of free mobile connectivity and free in-person digital skills training.
- Devices provided by World Wide Tech Group, working with Lloyds Bank, Empaua Ventures and Vodafone.
- Working with Digital Inclusion Network members, we are supporting residents over the next year
